


Shaalvin for Women - Sample Schedule

- Each shiur has a Beit Midrash component with your chavruta and a shiur component to enable you to gain the most you can out of each and every shiur. Most of our shiurim meet twice a week and many of our shiurim and sichot are delivered in Hebrew.
- 2 A wide variety of shiurim to fit your goals and interests
- Every morning, every night, and throughout the day you will grow from the lively "kol shel Torah" in the Beit Midrash with your chavruta as you choose to learn the texts of whatever topic(s) you wish at the pace that works best for you surrounded and assisted by staff and faculty.
- 4 Chaburot are offered before shiurim in the morning and during lunch, dinner and after night seder in the Beit Midrash for even more text-based analysis in small groups with our outstanding faculty and administration.
- 5 Chessed opportunities abound on Monday afternoons and throughout the week.
- We provide three nutritious and delicious meals a day, every day including both "in-" and "off-shabbatot"
- Our unique "Shiurim and Siyurim" day-long or half-day siyurim preceded by shiurim based on Tanach, Chazal, and/or history to provide a rich background and context to the siyur.
- Our students have unparalleled access and exposure to gedolim; our Rosh Yeshiva, HaRav Yechezkel Yaakovson, shlit"a and S'gan Rosh Yeshiva, Harav Aryeh Hendler, shlit"a, deliver sichot and answer questions every week.
- 9 Night seder continues the independent learning of the day with your chavruta and the topic(s) of your choice.
- 10 Late night mishmar on Thursday nights with sichot, snacks and cholent!
- Wednesday afternoons provides other opportunities for learning as well including the David Project (where you learn about Israel's current events and advocacy) and the Chabura Workshop (where you work with a faculty advisor researching a topic of your choice culminating in a chabura with your peers and presenting an article in our Torah Journal, Shaalei Binah).
